

Extended Remote Viewing

Loch Lomond Scotland - UK September 24th-28th 2008

The 5-day ERV Graduate workshop will include audiovisual materials, computer presentations, written materials, and one-on-one practice in the skills necessary for carrying out real-life applications of Controlled Remote Viewing.

WEDNESDAY – CRV REVIEW AND MONITORING

A recap for those who have either just completed remote viewing training or for those new to the NRVG program. Target choices, protocols, and monitoring skills will be covered and practice sessions will give each student a chance to monitor CRV sessions. Different session scoring protocols will also be covered.

THURSDAY – PROJECT MANAGEMENT, TASKING AND ANALYSIS

Whatever the student's reason for taking remote viewing training, there are basic requirements for project management, tasking, and analysis that need to be considered when undertaking projects. For example tackling a business project requires a different set of rules to undertaking a missing child or cold police case. Students will take an RV project through from client request to feedback using a real-life situation.

FRIDAY – EXTENDED REMOTE VIEWING METHODS

Extended Remote Viewing (ERV) was developed by Captain Fred (Skip) Atwater at the U.S. Fort Meade military unit. ERV has been defined as remote viewing using an altered state of consciousness for an extended period of time. Various ERV methods will be covered with students eventually incorporating ERV into their CRV sessions.

SATURDAY – REMOTE INFLUENCE, ETHICS, AND APPLICATIONS

Remote Influence (RI) is the flip side of Remote Viewing (RV). RI has both positive and negative attributes and students are made aware of these and the ethics necessary for RI's application. Students will cover the different types of projects in which RI can be successfully used and will then incorporate RI into their CRV sessions.

SUNDAY – HIGHER STAGES INCLUDING TELEPATHY

Many RV trainers have hinted that there are more stages available to the student than the six that are currently taught. Higher stages such as telepathy, tangible targets, and map vectoring will be covered in this final day of study. Students will then incorporate these additional stages into their CRV sessions.
