

Living the Field

Well, have you read it yet? I am talking about 'The Field', by Lynne McTaggart, Editor of 'What Doctors Don't Tell You'. If not, let me put the secrets of the universe into a small phrase or saying.

In the beginning there was a bang – THE bang – the Big Bang. So big was the Big Bang that the echo of the noise is still with us, as a background radiation or white noise, known as 'the Zero Point Field'. Since this radiation is everywhere and is constant everywhere, mathematical models of the universe have factored its effects out. From this we have two models. A model of the large, Newtonian physics in the global or local picture and Eisteinian physics in the cosmic picture; and a model of the very small, quantum physics.

Reputable theoretical scientists have reworked the models with the Zero Point Field constant left in, and we have a model that works equally well at both extremes of scale.

From this outcome we can move into many areas of heretofore mystery and absurdity. As the reality of the quantum entity, its message, is available everywhere and simultaneously, talk of it travelling is unhelpful. Whatever it is, it just is – everywhere and now. And the description of the nature of the quantum entity is one of vibration. A vibrational quality that is available universally is a mechanism by which many phenomena can be effected and, hence, explained. Scientists do love to have a mechanism capable of creating what they observe before they can trust their observations.

Among the phenomena that have been explored with this possibility in mind Lynne reports on work conducted into Remote Viewing, reincarnation, communicating with animals, communicating with the dead, the explanation of homeopathy and other treatments by 'absent' substances. Lynne's own focus is the relevance of this in the field of healing.

The weekend of 5/6th April I attended a conference built around this book. This included addresses from some of the scientists identified in the book and several workshops exploring some of the possibilities of this work, including Remote Viewing and animal consciousness. The first weekend was attended by 1200 which included Mike Webster and Geoff Merrigan. Geoff is the leader of the Federation of Clinical Shiatsu

Practitioners (FCSP), he is known to Peter Rose and me through his involvement with the General Shiatsu Council. Geoff is a NLP practitioner as well as Shiatsu and has a long-standing interest in Remote Viewing.

Mike is the creator of Waveform, a technique by which energy healers can identify the location, strength and quality of the energy and know when the energy patterns have changed; both in their own practice and in the practice of others – critical skill for a teacher or assessor.

People with substantial background in the field, like Geoff and Mike, found some of the work thin. Mike was especially disappointed in the presentation of Dr Fabio Petrossi, whose pulsating magnetic fields appeared less precise than Mike's Waveform work. As someone who has taken Mike's programme, I have to agree with him. But it was a general event for a wide audience.

Having got these two together at last, we agreed to gather a group of specialists from a range of healing work to explore the issue of how much commonality can be found to bring training systems and recognition together. So far, we have we three, a Sacral Osteopath, a Crystal Therapist, a magnet therapist and more to be invited. We will write more on this when we have met.
